LNS Board of Directors and Committee Chairs



- Support to 80th Anniversary Campaign by participating in planning meetings, helping develop collateral, engaging donors, and any other ways needed.
- Ensure all systems, communications, and planning are up-to-date and ready to be passed off to incoming President.

- Continue to implement the 2023-2028 Strategic Plan, make adjustments as needed, and employ strategies to set LNS up for enduring success.
- Implement the new Board structure by adjusting roles and responsibilities as needed and ensuring all duties are fulfilled in accordance with the by-laws. Assess new Board structure to ensure functioning of Board and Parent Job roles best serve the school going forward; adjust as needed.
- Oversee design development and planning process of a "cohesive campus" project with hired architects. Prepare for design implementation and project management.

Steering

- Onboard 5 new faculty members and assess the onboarding process
 - What supports teachers in developing an understanding of our cooperative Reggio inspired school?
- Offer larger scale Professional Development Opportunities to LNS faculty
- Develop and offer a conference to New England early childhood educators on, "Play and Learning in Early Childhood." March 29, 2025

Director

Celebrate and support Lincoln Nursery School during its 80th Anniversary year. Launch an 80th Anniversary Campaign to ensure a bright and lasting future for our school. This campaign will focus on two funding priorities: Creating a Cohesive Campus and Investing In Our Excellence and will run through the end of the school year and be capped by our 80th Anniversary Gala in May. Throughout the year, current families and alumni will have opportunities to connect and support our school in a variety of ways at small meetings and large celebrations.

Development

<u>Sustainable Fiscal Excellence</u> via repeatable, scalable infrastructure (tools, processes, resources, etc.) that will enable LNS to confidently achieve its fiscal goals year-in and year-out.

Baseline Performance

- Hit the 2024-25 budget
- Optimize the balance sheet to invest in growth while maintaining appropriate liquidity
- Deliver a finalized, approved 2025-26 budget

Short-Term Optimizations

- Reformat existing resources into cleaner, more digestible formats (e.g. gantt chart)
- Establish internal performance criteria for our bookkeeping partner
- Develop a centralized knowledge base for the Budget Treasurer role (FAQ, procedures, etc.); ideally extensible to other roles & committees.

Long-Term Optimizations

- Research & perform preliminary cost/benefit analysis on what tools could add value (budget creation, regulatory compliance, etc.)
- Consult with finance leadership at top non-profit organizations in Boston to learn and catalog their best practices (to inform long-term optimizations)
- Research what other revenue streams may be available that LNS could qualify for (grants, low-interest loans, etc.)

Budget and Finance

Continue to develop strategies for executing the goals laid out in the 2023-2028 Strategic Plan. These include (but are not limited to):

- Organizing DEI resources internally
- Supporting DEI efforts in the studios by funding this years professional development for faculty/staff. Speaker Rebecca Minor will lead both a teachers/staff training and a community wide presentation in December about gender diversity.
- Engaging the LNS community with DEI-related events such as the reverse book fair and an occasional DEI newsletter (that highlights DEI-related events in the greater metro-west community)
- Learning/Partnering with additional schools/programs that are integrating DEI into their curricula/communities
- Liaising with other LNS committees to integrate DEI awareness/education into the fabric of LNS and ensuring we are recruiting and retaining a more diverse community

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Execute an enrollment and marketing strategy that will ensure LNS's sustainability in both the short and long terms. Continue to evaluate the program changes implemented around core school hours and afternoon program offerings. Pilot a toddler group and assess the feasibility of programming for younger than 2.9 yo.

Enrollment

Foster and build a joyful school community by offering opportunities for families and teachers to connect with one another. This will be achieved by on campus events, as well as family led events.



80 Years of Growing Through Community and Learning Through Play


The 2024-2025 school year marks 80 years of Lincoln Nursery School!
