Whether your child is off on his first baby sitting job, or grandma needs to entertain the grandkids for five days. . . it’s easier with some dough!

Play-dough

- 2 c flour
- 1 c salt
- 1 t cream of tartar

- 2 T oil
- 1 t food coloring

Mix everything in a saucepan. Cook over medium, stirring constantly until dough leaves the sides of the pan. Remove from the pan. When cool to touch, knead for a few minutes.
